Brown Collection at the Oklahoma Museum of Natural History, Red Earth Center, Gilcrease Museum, Wheelwright Museum, and the National Museum of the American Indian at the Smithsonian. Chef **Colin Shane** is a rising star in Santa Fe's glowing culinary scene. For the last five years, he has worked for several acclaimed mentors in kitchens around the world.
