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ENJOY A TASTE OF CHACO WITH AWARD-WINNING INDIAN MARKET ARTIST  
LORRAINE GALA LEWIS AND CHEF KAI AUTENRIETH AT THE ARTIST'S TABLE  
A Delicious Way to Benefit Education and the Arts

Two remarkable artists will join forces on Tuesday, August 15, 2017, for a memorable evening of art and cuisine to benefit education and the arts in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

*At the Artist's Table – A Taste of Chaco*, held at the Santa Fe School of Cooking during the week of Indian Market, will feature the art of **award-winning Indian Market artist Lorraine Gala Lewis**, the cuisine of **Kai Autenrieth, Executive Chef at the acclaimed restaurant Terra at Four Seasons Resort Rancho Encantado**, and conversations with both of these remarkable talents for an exclusive group of lucky guests. **Santa Fe Mayor Javier M. Gonzales** is the event's honorary chair.

The intimate nature of this signature event offers personal interaction with both the artist and the chef, as each makes a presentation about their work. As a special gift, every guest will receive a signed, limited edition original work of art by Lorraine Gala Lewis, inspired by the ancient artifacts found at Chaco Canyon. Kai Autenrieth plans a bountiful menu inspired by Lewis' art and heritage. A thoughtfully curated pairing of wines from Arroyo Vino will accompany the multi-course meal.

This is the seventh annual dinner showcasing the work of distinguished culinary and Native artists. The event takes place during one of the most exciting weeks of the year for art lovers. The SWAIA Indian Market, this year taking place on August 19-20, 2017, is Santa Fe's biggest annual event, held outdoors on the historic Santa Fe Plaza. More than 1,000 Native American artists from all over North America gather annually in the City Different to appear in a variety of

gallery shows and exhibit a breathtaking array of traditional and contemporary art at the juried market.

Lorraine Gala Lewis is an award-winning artist whose work has garnered 1<sup>st</sup>-place ribbons at the prestigious Santa Fe Indian Market, as well as awards at Native markets throughout the United States. Lewis is a Laguna/Taos/Hopi potter who studied at the Institute of American Indian Arts and the College of Santa Fe, in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Her exquisite work is inspired by the ancient puebloan pottery culture of the Southwest. For this event, she has created two limited-edition prints based on artifacts found at Chaco Canyon.

Chef Kai Autenrieth will create a multi-course menu that pays tribute to the art and heritage of Lorraine Gala Lewis, culinary traditions and ancestral influences. Autenrieth brings a distinct global perspective and command of international flavor profiles to Four Seasons Resort Rancho Encantado, building upon a culinary trajectory of 19 years that has traversed Tanzania, Saint Lucia, Australia, St. Maarten, Bermuda and the UK. Most recently Chef Autenrieth was Executive Sous Chef at Four Seasons Resort Nevis in the West Indies where he spent three and a half years honing his fine dining skills with a special focus on locally-sourced seafood and hands-on guest experiences such as a lobster dive followed by interactive cooking classes.

The 2017 *At the Artist's Table* dinner will benefit two worthy Santa Fe organizations. The City of Santa Fe Arts Commission's Youth Arts programs ensure that young people throughout the Santa Fe community benefit from Santa Fe's cultural abundance, and the Partners in Education Foundation for the Santa Fe Public Schools supports local public school teachers and students.
